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TIPS FOR SUCCESS ~ For the FOURTH

semester: All of the preceding PLUS:

There will be a clinical practicum PRIOR to entering the 4th semester.

You will elect a fourth semester cabinet and participate in planning your Pinning ceremony. You will be participating in 4th semester class fundraising and other extracurricular activities.

Review mental status guidelines and psychotropic medications prior to the start of the semester.

In Nursing 343

- Students wear appropriate non-uniform clothing
- There are many writing assignments. Review APA format and seek assistance from the campus writing laboratory if having difficulty.
- You should also review your reading and notes from Nursing 311 (Therapeutic Communication).
- Includes one or more visit(s) to a community based mental health service provider.

Rotations for Nursing 345 include critical care units and caring for complex patients with multisystem problems. Thorough clinical preparation is essential to provide safe care.

Nursing 347

- Will assist you in making the transition from student to professional nurse.
- Nursing 347 clinical (Preceptorship) allows students to gradually assume the role of an RN. You will be assigned to a preceptor and you will be in clinic for approximately 36-40 hours per week and follow the exact schedule of your preceptor. This may include night shifts, weekends, and holidays.

Working will be very difficult this semester due to the heavy content and having to be able to follow your preceptor's schedule.

Be prepared for extra fees this semester: application to take NCLEX, graduation fees, Livescan.

Complete a Graduation Petition by the required deadline.

It is your responsibility to make sure that both the Health Sciences office AND the college have your official transcripts on file. The Board of Registered Nursing will be sent confirmation of all degree requirements. Failure to have appropriate transcripts on file may cause in delay in being cleared to take the NCLEX-RN.

You must report all previous misdemeanor and felony convictions to the Board of Registered Nursing (BRN). The BRN will review all convictions as they relate to the qualifications, functions, or duties of a Registered Nurse. Each application is evaluated on a case-by-case basis. The BRN will require documentation related to the offense (see BRN Regulations).

You will complete a professional resume and cover letter and have a seminar on interview techniques in Nursing 347.

Participate in the Pinning Ceremony (official welcome into the profession) and college graduation ceremony.

Summary: You have persevered and completed your nursing education. Please participate in the survey that we will send you 6 months to 1 year after graduation so that we can work to improve our nursing program.
