ARTICULATION AGREEMENT
BETWEEN
ANTIOCH UNIVERSITY LOS ANGELES
AND
LOS ANGELES HARBOR COLLEGE

Effective 2015

Because there are adult students who can benefit from courses and programs provided by each institution, Antioch University Los Angeles (AULA) and Los Angeles Harbor College (LAHC) agree to enter into an Articulation Agreement, which will assist students who have acquired LAHC credit to transfer to AULA and thereby to earn a B.A. degree. By entering into this Articulation Agreement, both institutions will function cooperatively so as to encourage and support interested adult students in pursuing their education goals and completing a B.A. degree.

This agreement applies to students who apply for admissions to AULA on or after the effective date of this agreement and who desire to transfer credit earned from LAHC to AULA. This agreement specifically provides for the transferability of the courses as detailed in the attached document.

In addition, both institutions agree to cooperate in communicating information regarding this Articulation Agreement to interested adult students. AULA will provide written materials to LAHC advisors and will meet wit these advisors periodically to discuss the nature and content of the AULA B.A. Program. LAHC will distribute electronic and printed AULA materials to interested students and will communicate to them the nature and content of the AULA B.A. Program.

AULA and LAHC further agree that prior to publication, any and all statements regarding this Articulation Agreement which appear in university/college materials will be previewed and must be approved by the Articulation Officer of LAHC and Provost of AULA (or their delegates). Information regarding this Articulation Agreement will be publicized, within the policies stipulated by each institution, to its students.

Liaison activities between AULA and LAHC for the implementation and management of this Articulation Agreement will be conducted by the Provost at AULA and by the Articulation Officer at LAHC (or their delegates).

ANTIOCH UNIVERSITY LOS ANGELES and LOS ANGELES HARBOR COLLEGE Articulation Agreement General Studies Transfer Equivalents Effective 2015

Antioch University Los Angeles (AULA) welcomes applications from transfer students who have a minimum of 24 transferable semester units, although we suggest students complete 36 or more transferable semester units. While we encourage students to take courses in a variety of subject areas that promote strong writing and critical thinking skills, Antioch does not require students to complete their general studies in order to transfer.

Students should be aware that a minimum of 180 quarter units (120 semester units), including 90 quarter units (60 semester units) of upper division are required for graduation from Antioch, and the final 45 quarter units must be taken in residence at AULA. In order for the course to be accepted as transferable, a grade of "C" or better must be achieved.

Antioch does recommend that students begin completing some of their general studies as part of their transferable semester units. For additional counsel on these and other requirements, students and counselors should feel free to contact the AULA Admissions Office at any point in their program.

Courses transferable to Antioch University Los Angeles General Studies requirements

At least 6 quarter units (4 semester units) in each of the following six <u>Domains of Knowledge</u> are required in order to fulfill the distribution component of Antioch's General Studies requirement. Thus, if you took 1 course worth three semester units in one Domain, you would still need additional units to fulfill that area. Courses within a student's Area of Concentration (which is like a "major") may not also be used to complete a Domain. The following courses offered at Los Angeles Harbor College are transferable and meet the <u>Domains of Knowledge</u> as indicated:
