

#### ARTICULATION AGREEMENT Between

#### **CLARK ATLANTA UNIVERSITY**

and

#### LOS ANGELES COMMUNITY COLLEGE DISTRICT

Clark Atlanta University (hereinafter referred to as CAU) and Los Angeles Community College District Participating Colleges (hereinafter referred to as LACCD) hereby enter into the following agreement governing the matriculation at CAU of Associate of Arts and Associate of Science degree graduates from LACCD, beginning with Fall Semester 2008 and continuing for a period of three years, after which both institutions may agree to renew, modify or let the agreement expire on the agreed upon date.

#### During the period of this agreement, CAU will:

- 1. Accept students who have completed an associate degree in arts or science with junior level standing provided the following requirements are certified by LACCD:
  - Student has a minimum cumulative grade point average of 2.5;
  - Student has earned a minimum of 58 semester hours of eligible transfer credit, which includes only courses in which a grade of "C" or better was earned (Courses taken eight or more years previous to transfer will not be included in accepted transfer work);
  - Student has completed the agreed upon program of courses that are deemed to be equivalent to CAU courses; and
  - Student understands that he may need to complete additional prerequisites as required by the programs in which he/she enrolls at CAU.
- 2. Provide LACCD students entering CAU equal access to registration, class enrollment and financial aid as other students attending CAU.

#### During the period of this agreement, LACCD will:

- 1. Publicize the agreement among its students and faculty and identify potential students who would benefit from this articulation agreement;
- 2. Make available to prospective transfer students, through early advisement information and requirements for admission to CAU, a description of all required CAU core curriculium courses and the equivalent courses at LACCD; and
- 3. Provide prospective transfer students with up-to-date information on courses needed at CAU to complete the baccalaureate degree requirements.

#### Both CAU and LACCD will:

- 1. Monitor the academic performance of students enrolling under this agreement, identify problems, and work cooperatively to facilitate the seamless transfer of students between CAU and LACCD; and
- 2. Notify each other of any curricular changes relevant to this agreement in a timely manner.

# GENERAL GUIDELINES FOR TRANSFER ARTICULATION AGREEMENTS WITH CLARK ATLANTA UNIVERSITY

The following guidelines will govern Articulation Agreements between Clark Atlanta University and other post-secondary institutions:

- 1. Articulation Agreements shall be entered into with the primary goals being that they promote student access and retention to graduation by facilitating the seamless transfer of associate degree students to upper level programs at Clark Atlanta University (hereinafter referred to as CAU).
- 2. Articulation Agreements will allow students who have completed an associate degree at the partner institution to be admitted to CAU with junior level standing provided the following requirements are **certified** by the partner institution.
  - Student has a minimum cumulative grade point average of 2.5
  - Student has earned a minimum of 58 semester hours of eligible transfer credit, which includes only courses in which a grade of "C" or better was earned (Courses taken eight or more years previous to transfer will not be included in accepted transfer work)
  - Student has completed the agreed upon program of courses that are deemed to be equivalent to CAU courses (Equivalent courses must be attached to agreement)
  - Student understands that he/she may need to complete additional prerequisites as required by the programs in which he/she enrolls at CAU
- 3. Articulation Agreements will list all required CAU core curriculum courses and equivalent courses (or acceptable substitute courses) at the partner institution.
- 4. Students entering CAU under Articulation Agreements will have equal access to registration, class enrollment and financial aid as other CAU students.
- 5. CAU will work cooperatively with partner institutions to monitor the academic performance of students enrolling under Articulation Agreements, to identify problems, to participate in articulation meetings, and to notify each other concerning any contemplated curricular changes relevant to these agreements.
- 6. Articulation Agreements will typically be for a period of three years, after which both institutions may agree to renew, modify or let the agreement expire on the agreed upon date.
- 7. Articulation Agreements shall be signed by the Provost of CAU, or approved designee, and the appropriate counterpart from the other institution.
- 8. Approved Articulation Agreements shall reside in the Offices of Admission. Copies will be sent by Dean for Undergraduate Studies to Schools, Departments and Programs and to the Office of Records and Registration.
