STUDENTS WITH DEPENDENT CHILDREN (SWD)					
Population served:	Students attending a UC, CSU, or California Community College (CCC) who have dependent children under the age of 18 by July 1, 2020 for whom they provide more than half of their support during the academic year.				
Award Amount:	Access award up to \$6,000 for qualifying Cal Grant A and B recipients and up to \$4,000 for eligible Cal Grant C recipients.
