Grades: All courses on Cal-GETC must be completed with a “C” or better. A “P” (pass) is acceptable, but no more than 14 transferable semester units may be completed on a pass/no pass basis.

Approval Dates: Each course must have Cal-GETC approval at the time it was taken. The effective date is listed next to each course. If no effective date is listed, then the effective date is associated to when the course began at Harbor or the effective date began over 30 years ago.

California General Education Transfer Curriculum (Frequently Asked Questions)

Cal-GETC is a pattern of courses that California community college students can follow to satisfy lower-division requirements at the California State University (CSU) or University of California (UC) campus. Students should be aware that additional courses are usually required to fully satisfy the General Education requirements of the particular UC or CSU campus to which they transfer. Cal-GETC is not advisable for all transfer students, and we recommend meeting with a counselor to determine the appropriate general education option for your transfer goals.

Continuing Students (with Catalog rights prior to Fall 2025) intending on earning an Associate Degree for Transfer (ADT) or transfer to a CSU or UC without an ADT, then you have two choices: **Option 1)** Continue following CSU GE Breadth or IGETC (Visit the catalog archives) to find your CSU GE Breadth or IGETC pattern). **Option 2)** Transition to the Cal-GETC requirements to select your GE classes

Is Cal-GETC required for transfer to a CSU or UC campus?

NO. Cal-GETC is not admission requirement for transfer to either the UC or CSU and may not be best for students in high unit majors such as math and sciences. Cal-GETC is an alternative to completing the lower-division general education or breadth program at a CSU or UC campus for many transfer students but not all. Please be advised that the completion of Cal-GETC is required for students completing an Associate Degree for Transfer (AD-T) to a California State University.

What is certification of Cal-GETC?

Certification refers to official notification from Los Angeles Harbor College that a student transferring to any CSU/UC campus has completed courses fulfilling lower-division general education requirements. Cal-GETC certification must be requested by the students after being accepted to a CSU or UC campus. To obtain certification, students need to submit a request to the LAHC Admissions & Records (A&R) Office.

Can I get partial certification of Cal-GETC?

No.

Can Advanced Placement test scores be applied to Cal-GETC?

Yes. Students may earn Cal-GETC area credit for acceptable AP scores. Applying AP credit toward a major requirement will vary by UC/CSU campus. Please see a LAHC counselor when using AP credit for transfer.

Can I complete Cal-GETC coursework at more than one college?

Yes.

Can a course be used to satisfy a Cal-GETC area and a major requirement?

Yes. LAHC will certify courses taken at other California Community Colleges. These courses will be placed in the same Cal-GETC category identified at the offering college. Courses taken at other regionally accredited colleges/universities that do not have a Cal-GETC pattern may be used on Cal-GETC if the course is comparable to an approved Cal-GETC course at LAHC or another California Community College. International coursework is not acceptable for Cal-GETC. For courses completed outside of LAHC, please visit a LAHC counselor for advisement.

Can I use Cal-GETC to earn an Associate Degree?

Yes. Cal-GETC certification will satisfy the LAHC local general education requirement for an associate degree.

Can I use Cal-GETC to obtain a Certificate of Achievement?

Yes. Certification earns a Certificate of Achievement in Cal-GETC.

Can I use the CSU GE or IGETC pattern instead of Cal-GETC?

Please speak with a Counselor about the catalog rights and continuous enrollment policy as it pertains to the CSU GE or IGETC pattern. New students attending College for the first time in Fall 2025 must use the Cal-GETC pattern.

How does IGETC (Intersegmental General Education Transfer Curriculum) courses apply toward Cal-GETC?

Courses completed under IGETC pattern prior to Fall 2025 may be applied to Cal-GETC certification if they align with the corresponding Cal-GETC areas excluding Area 1C. COMM 104, 121, 122 & 151 may not be applied towards Cal-GETC 1C. Exception: COMM 101 may be used towards Cal-GETC area 1C.

When applying courses from IGETC, please refer to the Assist.org for a complete listing of courses and their approval dates. If a student completes a course in a year it did not appear on the IGETC course list, it cannot be used for the Cal-GETC certification.

How does Cal-GETC courses apply toward IGETC?

Courses taken under Cal-GETC starting Fall 2025 or later may be applied toward IGETC certification if they are approved for the corresponding IGETC areas.

AP EXAMS APPROVED TO CLEAR SPECIFIC Cal-GETC GE AREAS ([Cal-GETC Standards 1.2 version](#))

A score of 3, 4, or 5 is required to grant credit for Cal-GETC certification. Generally, an acceptable score of 3, 4, or 5 for Cal-GETC equates to 3 semester units for certification purposes (Please check Cal-GETC Standards 1.2 section 6.1 for exceptions). **Note:** Actual AP transfer credit awarded is determined by the CSU and UC. Students must check the transfer institution's college catalog or website for units awarded toward the minimum 60 units required for admission and credit towards major preparation.
